


What Lesson can we learn?

the Lord, he lied and said he didn't know what had happened. The Lord wasn't happy with this answer, or with the black balloons that filled the sky


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

Noah's son asked him why the sky was so dark, and Noah explained that God was sad, but He had to destroy the people because they wouldn't listen to His warnings.



The final world is still to come- The New World or Kingdom on Earth.





But then something amazing happened! Something that Satan


never expected. Jesus rose from the dead and ascended into heaven! Jesus made away for black balloons to become white as well.




NUMBER OF BALLOONS IN THE AIR

Jesus is coming back so keep your faith




